Submission of Notice of Cancellation of Large Generator Interconnection  
Agreement

Dear Secretary Bose:

Pursuant to section 35.15 of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's ("Commission") regulations, 18 C.F.R. § 35.15, Southwest Power Pool, Inc. ("SPP") submits for filing a notice of cancellation of the Large Generator Interconnection Agreement ("LGIA") between SPP as Transmission Provider, Dawn Wind, LLC ("Dawn Wind") as Interconnection Customer, and Southwestern Public Service Company ("SPS") as Transmission Owner ("Dawn Wind LGIA").<sup>1</sup> SPP respectfully requests that the Commission accept the cancellation of the Dawn Wind LGIA effective March 27, 2012.

### **Background and Notice of Cancellation**

On November 6, 2008, SPP filed the Dawn Wind LGIA in Docket No. ER09-251-000, which the Commission accepted by delegated letter order on December 23, 2008.<sup>2</sup> On December 28, 2011, in accordance with Article 2.3.1 of the Dawn Wind LGIA, Dawn Wind sent a letter to SPP requesting termination of the Dawn Wind LGIA. On January 20, 2012, SPP notified Dawn Wind in writing that SPP had received Dawn Wind's request for termination of the Dawn Wind LGIA and that, consistent with Article 2.3.1 of

the Dawn Wind LGIA, SPP would terminate the Dawn Wind LGIA effective March 27, 2012, which is 90 days after the request for termination.<sup>3</sup>

Accordingly, SPP is notifying the Commission that it is terminating the Dawn Wind LGIA effective March 27, 2012.

### **Effective Date and Waiver**

SPP requests that the Commission grant an effective date of March 27, 2012 for the notice of cancellation of the Dawn Wind LGIA. SPP further requests waiver of the Commission's sixty day notice requirement to permit such an effective date.<sup>4</sup> Good cause exists for such a waiver because, consistent with Article 2.3.1 of the Dawn Wind LGIA, March 27, 2012, is 90 days after Dawn Wind requested termination of the Dawn Wind LGIA.

### **Service**

SPP is serving a copy of this filing on the representatives for Dawn Wind and SPS listed in the Dawn Wind LGIA.
