Reference: Sixteenth Revised Westar Agreement

Dear Mr. Brown:

On September 28, 2012, you submitted on behalf of Southwest Power Pool, Inc. (SPP): (1) an executed Network Integration Transmission Service Agreement between SPP as transmission provider and Westar Energy, Inc. (Westar), and its subsidiary Kansas Gas & Electric, as network customer; (2) an executed Network Operating Agreement (NOA) between SPP as transmission provider and Westar as both network customer and host transmission owner; and (3) an executed NOA between SPP as transmission provider, Westar as both network customer and host transmission owner, and Oklahoma Gas and Electric Company as host transmission owner. SPP designated the agreements, collectively, as Sixteenth Revised Service Agreement No. 607 under its tariff. Pursuant to authority delegated to the Director, Division of Electric Power Regulation—Central, under 18 C.F.R. § 375.307, the submittal in the above referenced docket is accepted for filing effective September 1, 2012, as requested.¹

Notice of the filing was published in the *Federal Register* with protests, comments, or motions to intervene due on or before October 19, 2012. Under 18 C.F.R. § 385.210, motions to intervene are timely if made within the time prescribed by the Secretary. Under 18 C.F.R. § 385.214, the filing of a timely motion to intervene makes the movant a party to the proceeding, if no answer in opposition is filed within fifteen days. No protests or adverse comments were received.
