**Re: *Southwest Power Pool, Inc.*, Docket No. ER12-1179-\_\_\_\_**  
Supplemental Representation in Compliance with Commission Order  
Concerning SPP Integrated Marketplace

Pursuant to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's ("Commission") "Order Conditionally Accepting Tariff Revisions to Establish Energy Markets," issued on October 18, 2012,<sup>1</sup> Southwest Power Pool, Inc. ("SPP") hereby supplements its February 15, 2013 compliance filing in this proceeding. The purpose of this supplement is to provide information to the Commission, as directed in paragraph 317 of the October 18 Order, regarding a particular transaction under a grandfathered agreement ("GFA") between Nebraska Public Power District ("NPPD") and Basin Electric Power Cooperative ("Basin").<sup>2</sup>

Pursuant to a reservation secured under this GFA (denominated "GFA 496" under SPP's Attachment W, and associated with NPPD Oasis Reservation No. 520962), NPPD

Heartland Consumers Power District ("Heartland") and Missouri River Energy Services ("MRES") are participants in the MBPP. Neither Heartland nor MRES is a member of SPP as of the date of this filing.

As discussed in the October 18 Order, Heartland and MRES raised concerns regarding how the service under this GFA would be treated in SPP's Integrated Marketplace. SPP subsequently informed Heartland and MRES that SPP would address this matter in a compliance filing. In lieu of including this matter in the upcoming March 15, 2013 Status Report describing the status of GFA negotiations, SPP submits this letter.

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provides transmission service to Basin from the Laramie generator to a sink in the Western Area Power Administration ("WAPA") Balancing Authority. None of the power transmitted under this 272 MW reservation flows through, into, or out of the SPP region. This service is not associated with any reservation on SPP's OASIS and sources and sinks entirely within the WAPA Balancing Authority.

Concerning treatment of this reservation in the context of SPP's proposed Integrated Marketplace, SPP hereby confirms that because this reservation is not associated with an SPP Settlement Location or SPP transmission service, and is not tagged by SPP, it will not be subject to the rules and tariff requirements of SPP's proposed Integrated Marketplace. Accordingly, the service associated with this reservation will not be assessed congestion costs or marginal losses resulting from the implementation of SPP's Integrated Marketplace.

SPP trusts that this information fully addresses all issues associated with this reservation/service.
