Re: *Southwest Power Pool, Inc.*, Docket No. ER15-2520-000
Refund Report

Dear Secretary Bose:

In accordance with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's ("Commission") letter order issued on October 13, 2015,¹ Southwest Power Pool, Inc. ("SPP") submits a refund report.

On August 25, 2015, SPP submitted for filing an executed Service Agreement for Firm Point-to-Point Transmission Service ("Service Agreement") between SPP as Transmission Provider and Kansas City Board of Public Utilities ("KCBPU") as Transmission Customer ("Fourth Revised KCBPU Service Agreement").² SPP filed the Fourth Revised KCBPU Agreement because it included terms and conditions that did not conform to the standard form of service agreement set forth in the SPP Open Access Transmission Tariff ("SPP Tariff").³ As detailed in the August Filing, the Fourth Revised KCBPU Agreement modified and superseded the Service Agreement between the Parties accepted by the Commission on January 15, 2015 in Docket No. ER15-77-

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001.⁴ In the August Filing, SPP also requested a waiver of the Commission's notice requirements to permit an effective date of August 1, 2015 for the Fourth Revised KCBPU Agreement.

In the October Letter Order, the Commission accepted the Fourth Revised KCBPU Agreement but denied SPP's request for waiver of the 60-day prior notice requirements.⁵ Instead, the Commission made the Fourth Revised KCBPU Agreement effective on October 23, 2015. The Commission further required SPP to make time value refunds within 30 days of the October Letter Order and directed SPP to file a refund report with the Commission within 30 days thereafter.

As of the date of the October Letter Order, SPP had not billed KCBPU based on the new Wholesale Distribution Service Charges included in the Fourth Revised KCBPU Agreement. Although SPP requested an August 1, 2015 effective date for the Fourth Revised KCBPU Agreement, pending a Commission order accepting the agreement, SPP continued to bill KCBPU the Wholesale Distribution Service Charge of \$842.47 included in the Third Revised KCBPU Agreement.⁶ Because SPP billed KCBPU a charge of \$842.47 for Wholesale Distribution Service Charges for the period of August 1, 2015 through October 22, 2015, a refund is not necessary.

SPP is serving a copy of this filing on all parties to the service list in this docket, and on all representatives for the Parties to the Fourth Revised KCBPU Agreement.
